

Distributor VFD Checklist

<u>A "Distributor" means any person who distributes a medicated feed containing a VFD drug to</u> <u>another person.</u>

- Review the JBS United Veterinary Feed Directive for Distributors brochure for VFD information
- Review the VFD Resource Center (JBSUnited.com/VFD) and periodically check the site for updates
- ✓ Review FDA's #120 Guidance for Industry on the VDF Resource Center (JBSUnited.com/VFD) to familiarize yourself with the VFD requirements
- Know which medications and medicated feeds are currently inventoried, and which products will require a VFD
- Know which medications and medicated feeds are available from your suppliers
- Develop an inventory control plan to account for unpredictable usages and unused product when VFDs expire
- ✓ Upload distribution sites into the *Global Vet Link* site (if currently using e-VFDs) by contacting GVL Sales 515-817-5703 or GVL Support 515-817-5704
- Develop a return goods policy (factoring in biosecurity measures) when requested to return unused product sold to a client
- Develop a record-keeping system to maintain VFDs and related records
- ✓ Provide a one-time Notice to FDA of Distributing VFD Feeds
- Request an Acknowledgement of Distribution of Limitations of VFD Feeds if you distribute a VFD feed to another distributor
- Comply with all applicable state and federal feed regulations that apply to your operation
- Prepare for regulatory inspections to occur unannounced and designate a person who is authorized to accompany the inspector
